









	Christians believe God loves people so much that Jesus was born, lived, was crucified and rose again to show God's love.

	Characteristic	Qualities that typically belong to God/person.
	Omnipotent	God is all-powerful.
	Omniscient	God knows all things.
	Holy	God is awesome and amazing. God is morally pure and hates

		sin — God is separate from human beings, who are sinful.
Symbol	Vocabulary	Definition
	Loving	God wants the very best for human beings, and does a lot to care for them.
	Eternal	God created time and is not limited by it — God is outside time: God does not get old like human beings.
	Spirit	God is not physical — God does not have a body.
	Crucifix	Shape of a cross.
	Altar	Table where bread and wine are blessed.
	Font	A place where Christening takes place.
	Lectern	Holy Bible is read from here. Eagle shaped.
	Pulpit	The minister teaches from this raised platform.
	Apse	Semi-circular recess at the altar (East) end.
	Sanctuary	Innermost, holy part of the church.
	Chancel	Part of the church in front of the altar.
	Nave	Central part of church intended to seat the most people.
	Transept	The two parts which cross the nave to form the cross shape.
