Crevice-

a narrow opening or fissure, especially in a rock or wall.

Tranquil- free from disturbance; calm

Balance- an even distribution of weight enabling someone or something to remain upright and steady.

Serene- calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil.

Crag- a steep or rugged cliff or rock face.

Wilderness- an uncultivated, uninhabited, and inhospitable region.

Clamber- climb or move in an awkward and laborious way, typically using both hands and feet.

Secluded- a place not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private.
